


How to record feral cat activity




What is FeralCatScan?

2. Easy to use and free App for field data collection.
3. A central location for feral cat sighting and control data
4. Raise awareness of the scale of problems with feral cats
5. Bring people together in groups to work together, such as Landcare
6. Receive updates about feral cats in your local area.
7. Ongoing program – and your feedback helps to improve FeralCatScan.


What FeralCatScan offers?

- 1. Website and mobile App (which works in remote areas).**
- 2. Record sightings, evidence, damage and control activities.**
3. Create maps of local feral cat problems.
- 4. Centralise your observations of feral cats.**
- 5. Share that cat data with a contract trapper.**
6. Join or create an online group for your landholder network.
- 7. Download the free Mobile App (Apple/Android) for recording feral cats quickly and easily with your phone.**
8. Communicate current situation to the community.
- 9. Control data is NOT displayed to the general public.**





Map where you have seen feral cats, evidence, damage, and control actions.




Submit your record, and view it on the Map. View other records in your local area.
