Record information into FeralCatScan to help protect farmers and biodiversity.

FerlaCatScan is a free community resource for monitoring, mapping and managing feral cats. People are using FeralCatScan to record feral cat activity and coordinate local control programs. It can be used by landholders, community groups, local government, pest controllers and biosecurity organisations. Recording feral cat information in 4 simple steps

1. Select feral cat



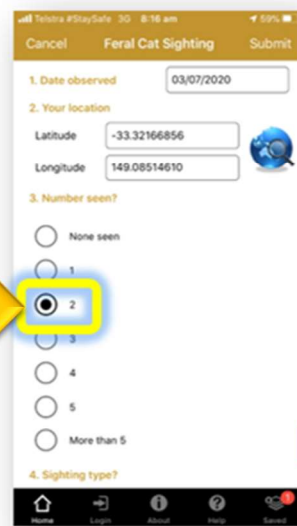
From the app home screen select the feral cat image.

2. Select data type



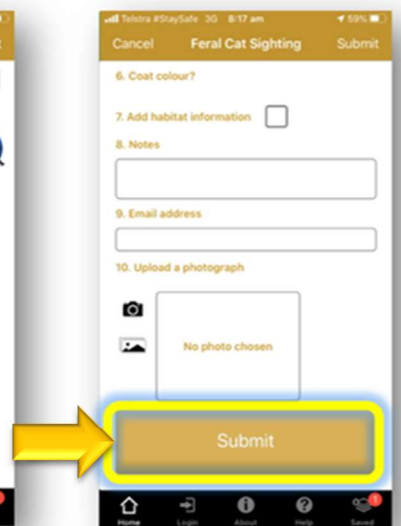
Select either the 'Sightings' 'Damage' or 'Control' buttons to begin recording.

3. Answer the questions



The date and location will automatically appear. Answer all relevant questions.

4. Submit report



Upload a photo (optional) then select 'Submit'.
