Record information into ToadScan to help protect farmers and biodiversity.

ToadScan is a free community resource for monitoring, mapping and managing cane toads. People are using ToadScan to record toad activity and coordinate local control programs. It can be used by landholders, community groups, local government, pest controllers and biosecurity organisations. Recording cane toad information in 4 simple steps

1. Select toad




From the app home screen select the toad image.

2. Select data type




Select either the 'Sightings' 'Damage' or 'Control' buttons to begin recording.

3. Answer the questions



The date and location will automatically appear. Answer all relevant questions.

4. Submit report



Upload a photo (optional) then select 'Submit'.
